Funding for Social Housing

Lee recently announced that 35 housing co-operatives and non-profit organizations located in Alberta would be receiving nearly **\$2.2 million** through Canada's Economic Action Plan, as part of the social housing renovation and retrofit investments while at the Whippetree West Housing Co-op in Calgary.

"Our Government remains committed to giving a hand-up to Canadians who need it most," said Lee, "that's why we are pleased to have invested in the renovation and retrofit of these units in Alberta, which will go a long way to providing safe and affordable homes for years to come."

Support for Post-Secondary Education

Bow Valley College

Through the Economic Action Plan the Federal Government provided **\$5,122,500** in KIP (Knowledge Infrastructure Project) funding to redevelop Bow Valley's North Campus.

Construction was recently completed, with renovations going towards improving the spaces where career programming including practical nursing, pharmacy technician, justice studies, and early learning and child care programs are held. These improvements will allow for an additional 960 practical nurse and health care aide graduates, and 300 justice studies graduates over a five-year period.

Mount Royal University

Mount Royal University received its largest donation since becoming a University two years ago. The Royal Bank of Canada donated **\$1.1 million** to develop the

'Innovation and Entrepreneurship Centre' at the Bissett School of Business.

In February Prime Minister Stephen Harper formally recognized the value of entrepreneurs to the economic prosperity and quality of life of all Canadians by declaring 2011 the 'Year of the Entrepreneur.'

Talisman Centre

The Federal Government was pleased to invest \$1 million to help renovate and improve the infrastructure of the Talisman Centre for Sport and Wellness. Over the course of its 28 year history, the Talisman Centre has provided athletes who are serious about fitness with an inclusive atmosphere and wide spectrum of world class training services. It also has served as the training facility for many of Canada's Olympic, Paralympic and World Champion athletes.

Green Municipal Fund

A GMF grant contribution for the City of Calgary for \$328,850 will go towards reducing community-wide greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, one of the three top priority areas for its urban sustainability plan.

The community-wide GHG reduction plan falls out of Calgary's larger long term plan for urban sustainability, *imagineCALGARY*, one of the largest sustainability visioning processes ever organized in Canada. More than 18,000 citizens were involved in developing, among other things, short- and medium-term GHG-reduction targets.

The newly named Flames Community Arena, located at 7th Avenue, SW recently celebrated its grand re-opening thanks to an investment of \$1 million from the Federal Government. The money will help promote amateur sport by providing much needed extra ice time for Calgary families, and improving the quality and availability of amateur and youth sports.

Over a two-year period the Federal Government has dedicated \$500 million in recreational infrastructure funding for communities across the country, including 718 here in Western Canada.

Literature in Alberta

WordFest

International Writers Festival will be able to carry out its activities for the next three years, thanks to funding from the Federal Government.

WordFest is Canada's third-largest literary event.

The 2011 edition of WordFest, which takes place from October 11-16, 2011 will stage more than 60 public events, including readings and discussion groups with authors. "WordFest is a nationally and Internationally recognized writers festival that brings the best of the literary arts to Calgary and Banff, while promoting Alberta's regional talent nationally and abroad," said Jo Steffens, Director of WordFest.

Reducing Red Tape for Businesses

Red Tape Reduction Commission

The Red Tape Reduction Commission was created to help find effective and lasting solutions to support Canadian small and medium-sized businesses.

It will consult with Canadians and Canadian businesses to identify irritants that have a clear detrimental effect on growth, competitiveness and innovation. The Commission will also look at the cost associated with federal regulatory requirements that businesses face, and provide advice on permanent solutions for reducing the overall compliance burden.

“ Canadian businesses spend billions of dollars each year adhering to regulations, ” added Lee Richardson, Member of Parliament “We need to look at where and how we can reduce these costs and this red-tape burden, especially on small businesses. ”

The Federal Government invested **\$750,000** towards a project facilitated by the not-for-profit industry and stakeholder association, Petroleum Technology Alliance Canada (PTAC).

The government is supporting the capacity of small and medium-sized businesses to commercialize new technologies that will reduce costs, maximize recovery, and bring forth efficiencies in the natural gas industry. PTAC 's mandate is facilitating innovation, collaborative research and technology development, demonstration, and deployment for a responsible hydrocarbon industry.

In December 2010, PTAC added the responsibility of providing seed money for technology projects to its mandate.
