Red Tape Anyone?

No thanks!

Prime Minister Stephen Harper created the **Red Tape Commission** in January 2011 to listen to small business leaders about government Red Tape that they face, and address ways to reduce these hindrances that impede productivity.

The Hon. Maxime Bernier announced the findings in September 2011 in the 'What Was Heard' report.

Currently, federal departments and agencies are analyzing and addressing the 2,300 suggestions and comments that were heard. The final report will be released later in 2011 including recommendations for the government to reduce Red Tape.

Clearly, reducing Red Tape is good for everyone. It will help our businesses compete and create jobs for Canadians.

Let's Talk Money! Budget 2011 Highlights

The focus of the Next Phase of Canada's Economic Action Plan will invest in the key drivers of economic growth: Innovation, Investment and Education / Training. In doing so, the Government will strengthen Canada's fiscal advantage.

Supporting Job Creation by helping businesses and entrepreneurs succeed, keeping taxes low, investing in projects of national importance, and maintaining Canada's reputation as one of the best places to invest. We will support Job Creation by:

- providing a temporary Hiring Credit for Small Business to encourage additional hiring;
- renewing the Best 14 Weeks and Working While on Claim EI pilot projects for one year; and
- extending the temporary 15-per-cent Mineral Exploration Tax Credit for an additional year (until March 31, 2012) to help companies raise capital for mineral exploration.

Supporting Families and Communities so that all Canadians enjoy a high standard of living and our communities stay vibrant and safe. We will support Families and Communities by:

- enhancing the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) for those seniors who rely almost exclusively on their Old Age Security and the GIS and may therefore be at risk of experiencing financial difficulties;
- introducing a Family Caregiver Tax Credit and Children's Arts Tax Credit to support Canadian families; and
- providing nearly \$870 million over two years to address climate change and air quality, including the extension of the ecoENERGY Retrofit to help homeowners make their homes more energy efficient and reduce the burden of high energy costs.

Investing in Innovation, Education and Training to promote research in leading-edge technologies and to provide Canadians with the opportunity and incentives to acquire the skills needed for jobs in today's labour market. We will invest in Innovation, Education and Training by:

- helping small and medium-sized businesses speed along collaborative projects through the Industrial Research Assistance Program through funding over the next three years;
- establishing 10 new Canada Excellence Research Chairs;
- enhancing and expanding eligibility for the Canada Student Loan and Grant Program for part-time and full-time post-secondary students; and
- helping apprentices in the skilled trades and workers in regulated professions by making occupational, trade and professional examination fees eligible for the Tuition Tax Credit.



Investing in Canada's long-term prosperity will increase the well-being of all Canadians while preserving the public services and culture that define us as a nation.

Preserving Canada's Fiscal Advantage in order to be able to invest in the priorities of Canadians, to keep Canada's economy growing strongly, and to maintain low interest rates. We will preserve Canada's Fiscal Advantage by:

- reaffirming the Government's plan to return to balanced budgets without raising taxes, without cutting programs for seniors, children, or the unemployed, without cutting transfers to other levels of government that support health care and social services, and without cutting the gas tax transfer to municipalities; and
- identifying savings of more than \$500 million annually from the 2010 round of strategic reviews. Together with measures to restrain the growth of National Defence spending, the first cycle of strategic reviews has resulted in \$11 billion in savings over seven years and more than \$2.8 billion in ongoing savings.

Improving the efficiency and effectiveness of government operations and programs will **ensure value for taxpayer money.**

Our Government will complete a comprehensive Strategic and Operating Review of direct program spending by the end of 2012. Our Government remains committed to balancing the budget by 2014 partly through reducing expenses learned from this Review. Without including any targeted savings from this Review, the Government is projected to return to balanced budgets by 2015-16.
